They want to return to their home country voluntarily.





# **Counseling centers**

You can find on the web site:

- Counseling centers near you.
- Online consultations in the countries.



### **Programs**

We show on the web site many aid programs:

For example:

- Migrants can get a flight ticket or travel money.
- Migrants can get money after returning to their home country.



### **Country info**

Here you can find everything about the aid programs in a country.

You can search the info in a data base.

A data base collects a lot of info.

The data base is called **ZIRF Data Base**.

Migrants can ask questions themselves.

IOM employees answer the questions.

Later, the answers can be found in the data base.

#### **ZIRF-Database**

As part of ZIRF Counselling, you can ask individual questions about your country of origin via a counselling centre that is authorized to make inquiries. The information is researched by the IOM on site and can help you make decisions and prepare for a possible voluntary return.
